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Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports

What is PBIS?

- PBIS is a framework to identify needs, develop strategies, and evaluate practice toward building a positive school culture
- Teaches children appropriate behavior and provides the supports necessary to sustain that behavior
- Clear school wide expectations with incentives and consequences
- Behavioral recognition system for students doing the **right** thing
- Internal team made up of teachers from various grade levels

Role of Teachers in PBIS

- Define expectations
- Teach and model expected behavior
- Provide opportunities for practice
- Review expectations regularly
- Monitor performance of expected behaviors
- Recognize individuals when expected behaviors are demonstrated
- Re-teach the expected behaviors to students as needed
- **Catch students being GOOD!**

<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Remain quiet• Go directly to the bathroom and return directly to class	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Clean up after yourself• Give others privacy• Wait your turn• Flush the toilet	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Go in and out quickly• Wash your hands• Keep water in the sink• Turn off water when finished• Place trash in trash can• Report spills/problems to adults

Acknowledgement System

- Bobcat Brags
 - Used to reinforce positive, “Bobcat”, behavior
 - Given across the school by all faculty
 - Students receive opportunity to earn individual reinforcers and whole-school reinforcers



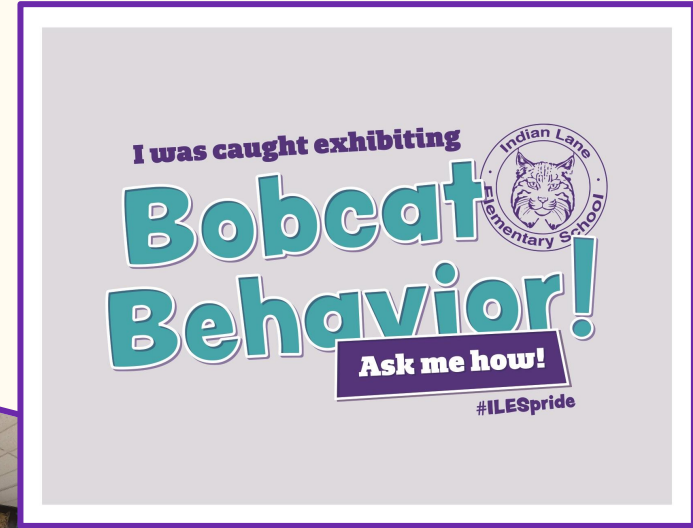
Individual Reinforcers

- Cut the tie
- Sit with a buddy at lunch
- Custodian assistant
- Principal assistant
- Read to a younger class
- Postcard home
- Lawn sign



Group Reinforcers

- When “Brag” wall is filled, a school-wide reward is decided upon (dance party, extra recess, stinky feet day etc.)



How Can Parents be Partners?

- Support and reinforce PBIS at home
- Have the same expectations at home
 - Be Ready ○ Be Respectful ○ Be Responsible
- Remind your child what the expectations are regularly
- Recognize and reinforce/reward your child when he/she follows the expectations
- Ask child how his/her Bobcat Brag was earned
- Spread the word! Take and post pictures using **#ILESPRIDE**
